About the Program

ACT 129 – Deregulation causes the Electrical Utilities to reduce demand...

BACKGROUND AND HISTORY OF THIS PROCEEDING

The energy efficiency and conservation program requires each electric distribution company (“EDC”) with at least 100,000 customers to adopt a plan to reduce energy demand and consumption within its service territory.

Governor Edward Rendell signed Act 129 of 2008 into law on October 15, 2008. The Act took effect 30 days thereafter on November 14, 2008. Among other things, the Act created an energy efficiency and conservation program, codified in the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code. This program requires an EDC (Electrical Distribution Company) with at least 100,000 customers to adopt a plan, approved by the Commission, **to reduce electric consumption by at least one percent (1%) of its expected consumption for June 1, 2009 through May 31, 2010, adjusted for weather and extraordinary loads. This one percent (1%) reduction is to be accomplished by May 31, 2011. By May 31, 2013, the total annual weather-normalized consumption is to be reduced by a minimum of three percent (3%). Also, by May 31, 2013, peak demand is to be reduced by a minimum of four-and-a-half percent (4.5%).**

About the Speaker

J. Michael Love serves as President and Chief Executive Officer of the Energy Association of Pennsylvania (EAPA), headquartered in Harrisburg. His more than 30 years as a utility executive and regulator provides the trade association with the necessary public policy expertise to represent the interests of the Commonwealth's 18 Public Utility Commission-regulated electric and natural gas distribution companies that provide service to more than 8 million commercial, industrial, and residential customers.

For more than 15 years, Mr. Love held increasingly more responsible executive level positions with Citizens Communication Company (formerly Citizens Utilities), which included service as President and Chief Operating Officer of the electric, gas, water, wastewater and propane operations of Citizens in 11 states, including Pennsylvania. These operations involved serving the utility needs of 3 million people.

Prior to entering the corporate arena, Mr. Love was appointed Chairman of the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission and, in that capacity; he served as President of the New England Conference of Public Utility Commissioners. In addition, he served as consumer advocate in New Hampshire.

His accomplishments have been nationally recognized by two of America's leading newspapers. In 1983, USA TODAY named Mr. Love as "Person of the Year" for the State of New Hampshire. As the state's PUC Chairman, the WALL STREET JOURNAL profiled Mr. Love on its front page right hand column.

Mr. Love received a juris doctorate degree from the University of Detroit and a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Michigan. Mr. Love has lectured on the utility industry and regulation at Dartmouth University, Franklin Pierce Law School and the University of New Hampshire.

An involved member of his community, Mr. Love serves on the Board of the Central Pennsylvania Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation and the Board of the Harrisburg Rotary. Mr. Love and his wife Vicki reside in the Harrisburg-West Shore area and have four grown children.

From Scranton, Wilkes-Barre:

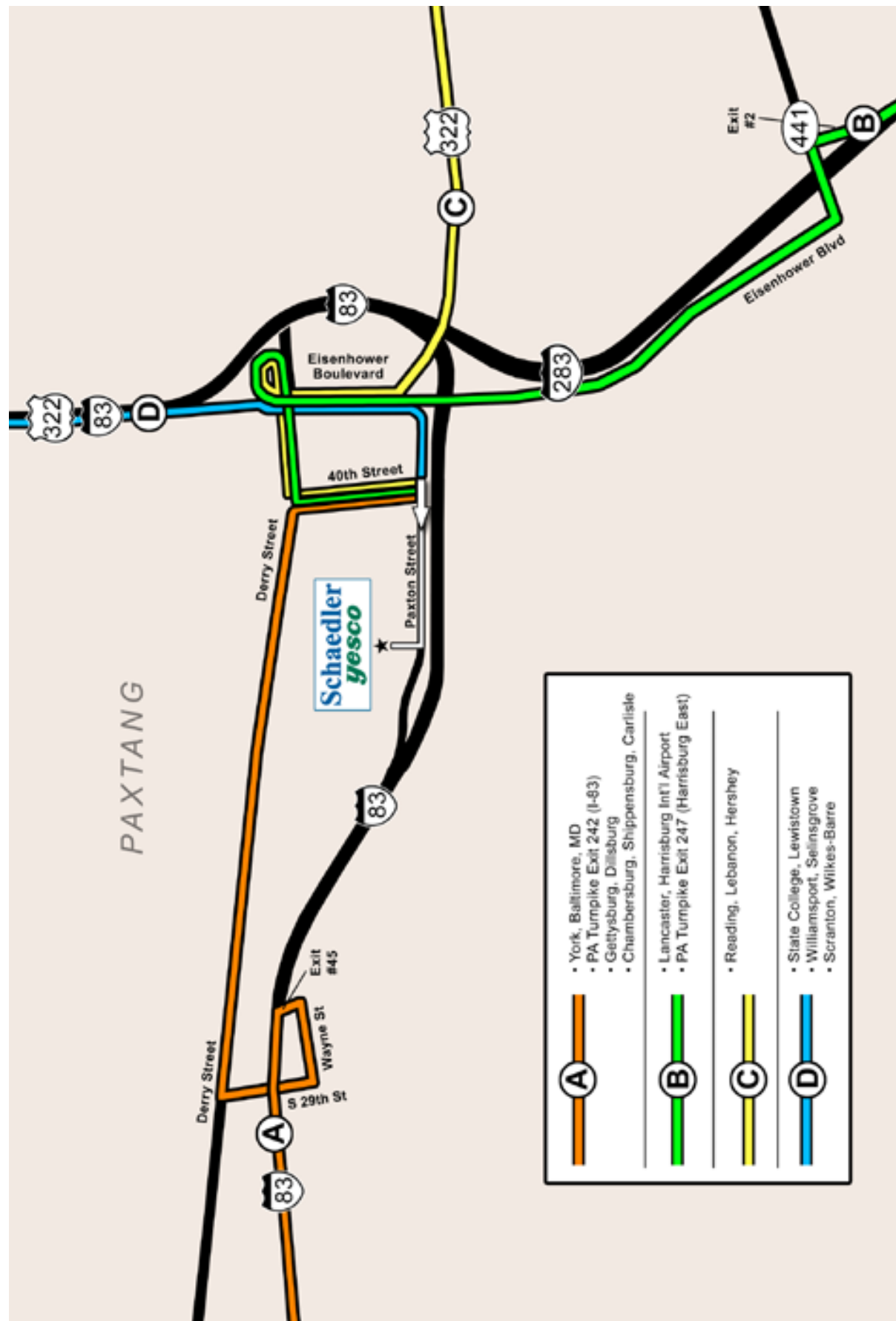
